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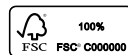

Andalusia, a tourism universe

It is one of the most comprehensive tourism destinations in the world, as well as being considered one of the safest by visitors.

A ndalusia offers an entire scaled-down tourism universe, the defining feature of which, is diversity. A variety reflected to perfection in **amazing landscapes** with contrasts that will enable tourists to enjoy warm valleys such as the Guadalquivir, the highest peaks of the Iberian Peninsula, fertile hill ranges, stretches of coasts barely touched by humans and volcanic rock formations such as the Tabernas Desert, the only one of its kind in Europe. A wealth of landscape and natural resources, with **protected areas of extraordinary ecological importance** located in the region of Andalusia, such as the national parks of **Sierra Nevada and Doñana**, home of the Iberian lynx.

This valuable environmental heritage, together with the **picturesque quality of**

its villages and deep-rooted traditions, attract visitors to our region each year, looking for a **more rural form of tourism** where they can be in contact with nature, in places such as the White Villages in Cadiz, the Serranía de Ronda (Malaga), the troglodyte habitat of Guadix and Altiplano (Granada), the Alpujarras in Granada and Almeria, the mining landscape of the Sierra Morena in Jaen and the Sierra de Aracena in Huelva.

Here, visitors can enjoy activities such as trekking, climbing, paragliding, cycle-tourism, white water rafting or skiing in the Sierra Nevada Ski and Mountain Resort. Not to mention the fact that Andalusia has the largest selection of **golf courses** in the whole of Europe.

The Andalusian coastline, stretching for more than 900 km and bathed by the waters of the Atlantic and the Mediterranean, offers **beaches** for all tastes, from **vast sandy beaches and small coves** to those equipped with all the facilities and services required to enjoy a perfect day out with all the family. Many of them receive the **Blue Flag Award for Clean Beaches in Europe** each year, making them the ideal place to practice **water sports** such as surfing, windsurfing or sailing.



The historical, cultural and monumental wealth of Andalusia is in itself an invitation to come and explore and it represents the identity of a land with a **vast artistic legacy** distributed across the entire region. Archaeological sites, a fabulous Hispanic-Moorish architecture, castles and fortresses, churches and monasteries, majestic mansions and immense industrial architectural works, all together form a hugely significant heritage, which has been recognised by the UNESCO, with the following being included on the **World Heritage** list: the Alhambra, Generalife and Albaicín in Granada; the

Historic Centre of Cordoba, including the Mosque-Cathedral and the Jewish Quarter; the Cathedral, Fortress and the General Archive of the Indies in Seville; the Archaeological Ensemble Dolmens of Antequera, the Caliphate City of Madinat Al-Zahra and the Rock Art of the Mediterranean Basin on the Iberian Peninsula.

It is the birthplace of **great artists and writers** such as Velázquez, Murillo, Lorca, Alberti, Juan Ramón Jiménez and Picasso, among many others, as well as being home to some of the best **museums in Spain**, such as the **Museum**

of Fine Arts in Seville, considered to be the second art gallery in Spain, the avant-garde **Pompidou Centre** and the Picasso Museum, both in Malaga. It is also the **setting for highly renowned and prestigious cultural contests**, that include all artistic fields and also **festivals** that reflect the **open and cheerful nature** of the Andalusian people, such as Easter Week (the central theme of the Route of Passion), the Cadiz Carnival or the April Fair in Seville.

Andalusian cuisine, based on Mediterranean ingredients, has gained international acclaim thanks to the **excellence of the products** (with numerous quality hallmarks) used by **Andalusian chefs** recognised with the stars awarded by the Michelin Guide, such as Ángel León and Dani García, in the creation of innovative and cutting-edge dishes but inspired by tradition. The gastronomy is, therefore, **extensive and imaginative**, and the best way to discover it is by trying **small portions of its gastronomy via tapas**, a gastronomic trend that is popular in the entire region.

It is one of the warmest regions in the whole of Europe, with over 3,000 hours of sunshine per year and average annual temperature of 16 °C

What is 'Andalusia, your Roots'?

The tourism initiative is aimed at markets seeking Moorish, Sephardic and Ibero-American tourism.

'**A** ndalusia, your Roots' is a **strategic project** developed by the Department of Tourism of the Regional Government of Andalusia, which goes beyond purely tourism aspects, by **incorporating values and aspirations** that appeal to historical and family bonds, in short, to people's **origin**. This innovative initiative offers travellers the chance to enjoy **unique experiences** related to their ancestors, in a region like Andalusia, which has always been an example of coexistence and cultural pluralism.

This is an **opportunity for development** created with a clear focus on the **business and tourism sector**

of Andalusia, to generate local employment and wealth, but also with the aim of building bridges between different communities and cultures which, over the centuries, have left a permanent mark on our region.

In order to attract tourists with historical, ancestral and deep-rooted bonds with Andalusia, this pioneering

project plans to **develop and promote our products and tourism packages** aimed at three **strategic segments**: tourism based on Moorish heritage, Sephardic tourism and Ibero-American tourism. This is the proposal that will be included in this Catalogue 'Andalusia, your Roots'.

The professional manual will offer **over one hundred experiences** distributed

across the entire region of Andalusia, which will enable visitors to the region in search of their 'roots' to not only enjoy **tourism experiences** with heritage resources dating back to the Al-Andalus period, but also take part in **Al-Andalus cooking workshops** and visit **areas with clear Al-Andalus roots**; visit the Jewish Courters of **Sephardic Andalusia**, with **gastronomic visits to**

kosher-friendly restaurants and attend **concerts in Ladino**; or visit places related to such relevant figures such as **Inca Garcilaso de la Vega**, among other sites.

Presented in the Caliphate City of **Madinat Al-Zahra**, recently declared World Heritage Site by the UNESCO, 'Andalusia, your Roots' has already

been promoted in **fairs, trade missions and FAMtrips** and presented to **agents specialising** in Jewish and Sephardic tourism in the United States and Israel; in the Hispano-American sector, in Argentina and to the **Council of Arab Ambassadors** and Arab intermediaries. It has also been presented to the **World Tourism Organisation**, the **Necstour Network** and the **European Parliament**.

Ibero-American roots

Ibero-American.

adj. Native of Ibero-America, a group of American countries that formed part of the kingdoms of Spain and Portugal.

Many people from Andalusia emigrated during the 19th century to the New Continent, intensifying their sentimental bonds that still remain today with their descendants.

The General Archive of the Indies in Seville is home to the most important documentary source of the cultural and commercial relations between Spain and the



Andalusia developed **close relationships with Ibero-America** from the end of the 15th century, closely related to the **Discovery of America** and the subsequent trade activity that was established between continents. Trade activities that resulted in bonds from the **comings and goings** on both sides of the ocean related to traditions, folklore, art or gastronomy.

Huelva, Seville and Cadiz are the three provinces in Andalusia that were most prominent during this historic period which really was the **Golden Age** of

Andalusia. In 1492, **Christopher Columbus** set sail from the **Port of Palos** in Huelva to discover America. In 1503, Seville became the head of the commercial monopoly with the New World, since it was there that the Casa de la Contratación de Indias was established, an institution that moved to Cadiz in 1717.

'**Andalusia, your Roots**' proposes **five routes** that include the following scenarios: The Preliminaries of the Discovery; The Kingdom of Granada; The first journey to the Indies; The

Gateway to America; The Atlantic Ports and Explorers, viceroys and indianos. Itineraries that will enable visitors to admire the Andalusian Mudejar works of art (first art of Columbian America), Andalusian cathedrals such as those in Seville and Jaen, which had a great influence on the religious architecture of America, and beautiful Baroque alcoves, with the background echoes of flamenco music influenced by the comings and goings from and to the Americas.

Particularly interesting is the mark left by famous characters that forged

Cordoba is one of the most repeated names in countless towns and cities of America, such as Cordoba in Veracruz, Mexico or Cordoba in Tucuman, Argentina



fascinating landscapes of the Modern and Contemporary Ages of the two continents. Special mention must be given to figures of the distinguished adopted montillano, **Inca Garcilaso de la Vega**, **Francisco Solano** “the American evangeliser”, **Diego Alvear y Ponce de León**, the **Gálvez** family from Malaga, or **José San Martín**, a prime military leader in South America successfully achieving Independence and he had a prominent role in the Battle of Bailén against the Napoleonic troops.

These **cultural, linguistic, religious and family ties** form a heritage reflected in 'Andalusia, your Roots', creating a complete tourism offer, managed by experts that will help travellers explore their “roots”. It also includes monumental itineraries for travellers to discover the **very best of architecture with Hispano-American influences**, visits to wineries and to Spanish Fighting Bull farms, **gastronomic routes** in which Iberico ham is the main protagonist and taverns in Cordoba, food pairing workshops and Flamenco-based tourism experiences.

Sephardic roots

Sephardic Jews.

Derived from the Hebrew Sepharad, place name originally identifying the Iberian Peninsula.

Jews from countries such as the United States, Israel, Canada or Argentina feel a special attraction towards Andalusia as a tourism destination.

Andalusia was, for centuries, a region that welcomed the Jewish community



Today, the descendants of Spanish Jews, **the Sephardic Jews**, represent around one fifth of the global Jewish population. Hence the importance given to this strategic segment, **Sephardic Tourism**, in the **'Andalusia, your Roots'** project, promoting tourism products that enable the **origins** of visitors' ancestors to be discovered, who were forced to abandon the peninsula in 1492. They left, but their roots, their houses, their

districts and their places of prayer remained in Andalusia.

Their historic traces are present in the different **routes** designed for the Sephardic community: **Large Capitals, Western Andalusia and Inland Andalusia**. They are the perfect opportunity to experience the Jewish influence in this region, by visiting important sites such as the **Jewish**

The Cordoba Synagogue was built in 1315 based on the characteristic Mudejar style of the period



quarter in **Cordoba** (which forms part of the Historic Centre of Cordoba inscribed on the **World Heritage List**), **Jaen** and **Lucena**, known as the Pearl of Sepharad.

These three towns form what is known as the triangle of Al-Andalus and they belong to the **Sepharad Routes**, a tourism initiative organised by the **Network of Jewish Quarters in Spain**.

The Jewish presence is amassed in the form of **monuments** that possess an exceptional artistic value, such as the **Cordoba Synagogue** (one of the four preserved in Spain dating back to the medieval era), the **Synagogue of Water** in Ubeda and the **Jewish Necropolis in Lucena**, the largest Jewish cemetery ever excavated in Europe, dating back to the Medieval period. Not forgetting the Jewish gastronomy, traditions, legends and relevant characters such as the doctor and mathematician from Cordoba **Maimonides**, probably the most important Hebrew figure to have been born on the Iberian Peninsula, with the permission of Hasday Ibn Shaprut.

In order to highlight the Sephardic culture and heritage, attracting visitors to return to the land of their ancestors, 'Andalusia, your Roots' also offers interesting **personalised proposals** that take into account particular features of this culture, in aspects such as gastronomy. Tourists can enjoy **concerts in Ladino** and take part in Sephardic **arts and crafts and food workshops** or K kosher oil and wine **tasting events**, among many others.

Andalusia has all the elements to be one of the leading halal-friendly destinations in the world.

Halal/halal-friendly tourism, one of the strategic segments of 'Andalusia, your Roots', is a recent phenomenon that covers a series of activities related to the **lifestyle of Muslim travellers** and which is having a growing economic impact at a global level. This is a new model of

tourism and a great opportunity for the tourism sector in the region of Andalusia, a region with an **identity** marked by **Islamic heritage**.

Spain is one of the most highly-rated destinations by Muslim tourists, particularly because it is the European destination with the most significant **Hispano-Moorish heritage**. And a large part of that monumental legacy is located in Andalusia, with **World**

Heritage Sites related to the Arab culture, such as the **Mosque** and the Caliphate City of **Madinat Al-Zahra**, both located in Cordoba, the **Alhambra and the Generalife** in Granada or the **Giralda** in Seville. These and other artistic treasures form part of the itineraries included in the **Routes of the Al-Andalus Legacy**, which cover the eight provinces in Andalusia, recalling landscapes, traditions and flavours from times gone by.

The tourism products offered to Muslim travellers by **'Andalusia, your Roots'**, also include services exclusively aimed at **respecting the beliefs and religious practices** relating to Islam. An example of this are the **'halal' hotels**, which do not serve alcoholic beverages; they offer "halal-certified" menus; they offer prayer rooms; and, in general, a pleasant and welcoming environment. In fact, the **type of accommodation** is one of the most important parameters

for Muslim tourists when organising holidays, which are normally **group or family holidays**.

Halal cuisine, based on Islamic religious precepts, forms part of many other tourism experiences in 'Andalusia, your Roots', either as part of routes that combine elements of heritage, nature and gastronomy, by way of workshops or sampling events. An entire culinary universe that inspires **Al-Andalus cuisine**.

The golden past of Al-Andalus draws tourists from mainly Muslim countries such as Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, United Arab Emirates (UAE), Qatar, Iraq, Kuwait, Iran and Oman



Activities such as visits to bazaars and marketplaces, Arab baths with relaxing massages, traditional music festivals and pottery workshops, enable Muslim tourists to establish that **bond with their roots**, which has brought them to Andalusia. Without forgetting other **more personalised plans**, which include routes across the numerous natural spaces in Andalusia, nautical experiences, important sporting events or shopping in the exclusive international designer stores.





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Andalusia, your Roots

The Ibero- American legacy

Disembarking in America brought to Andalusia economic prosperity and political relevance in the world, apart from a shared history that established bonds from the comings and goings on both sides of the ocean, which are still alive today.

Encountering the New World

With the West Indies Convoy system, Andalusia would become the economic and political centre of gravity of the world.

Andalusia would be the protagonist of one of the most significant events of universal history, the **Discovery of America**. Many were the **settings and places** involved in the events occurring after Columbus' achievement, related to **trade with the New Continent** and to a **cultural exchange** that has left a rich legacy in Andalusia. From **Granada**, where the adventure was planned, to the town of Palos in Huelva, which saw Columbus set sail, not forgetting of course, Seville, Cadiz or Cordoba, we can trace the chronology of this event that changed the course of history.

In Granada, the possibility of the journey of discovery materialised, as Columbus gained the sponsorship of the Catholic Monarchs for his project, signing an agreement in **April 1492**, which was sealed with a document known as the **Capitulations of Santa Fe**. Once the financing required was achieved, the admiral would head to Huelva, where, what is now known as the **Lugares**

Colombinos (Columbian Places), which are the places that were particularly relevant at the time of the first voyage of Christopher Columbus: Moguer and Palos de la Frontera, together with the Monastery in La Rábida.

shielded by the Franciscan order. Nearby, in front of the Celestino Mutis Botanical Park, on the shores of the Tinto River estuary and the **Las Carabelas Dock**, are the replicas of the Pinta and Niña caravels and the Santa Maria ship which, on the morning of the 3 August 1492, set sail from the **Palos Port** with a crew of brave sailors including **Martín Alonso Pinzón** or the

Niño brothers. **Moguer** offers interesting visits, including the Mudejar Monastery of **Santa Clara**, which would inspire the first American architecture; the **San Francisco Convent**, from where the friars departed for the Christian evangelisation, and the **House-Museum** of the winner of the Nobel Prize in Literature, **Juan Ramón Jiménez**, its most illustrious ambassador.

Did you know...



The actual Carnival of Cadiz, declared a festival of International Tourism Interest, owes much to overseas influences. Commercial visits by residents of Genoa, Venice or France brought with them masks and costumes to attend the dances which joined the sounds of *guajiras*, *habaneras* and *guarachas* from Cuba, interpreted by crews along the streets of the Tacita de Plata, leading to what we now know as the carnival.

Gateway to America

After Columbus' achievement, the **Casa de la Contratación** (House of Trade of the Indies) was established in **Seville**, converting the city centre of Seville into the hub of the Spanish empire and the head of the trade monopoly with America for over two centuries. It is a **cosmopolitan city** that brought together Genoese and German traders and also scoundrels and meddlers. Related to this time of splendour in the city of the **old Dockyards**, is the **Casa**

de la Moneda, the **old Tobacco Factory** (now the University), the **Universidad de Mareantes** (university for navigators), located in the **San Telmo Palace** and numerous **religious buildings** belonging to orders with interests in America.

Directly related to the New World in the Andalusian capital, are three monuments declared **World Heritage sites**: the **Reales Alcázares**, which were home to the Casa de la Contratación; the **Cathedral**, which is where the tomb

of Christopher Columbus is located and the Columbus Library, with exceptional works such as the Christopher Columbus Book of Prophecies; and, lastly, the **Archive of the Indies**, the Ancient Merchants Exchange in Seville. Without leaving the province, the American legacy is noticeable in buildings such as the **Hernán Cortés Palace** in Castilleja de la Cuesta and the **San Isidoro del Campo Monastery** in Santiponce, the centre for the export of farming goods for overseas.

La Rábida is home to the Ibero-American Headquarters of the International University of Andalusia, which enables scientific bonds to be formed with students and researchers on the other side of the

The city of **Cadiz** would replace Seville as the Gateway to America, marking the start of a period of great economic strength and profound urban development. The intense trade activities and the fear of pirate attacks would lead it to **fortify** itself, with defensive structures being erected that would have a great influence on the important fortified architecture that would be developed in Central and South America, recognised as World Heritage. Its urban landscape will also

fill with **palaces and stately homes** with their characteristic **towers-viewpoints** such as the Tavira Tower, where traders could spot the arrival of their ships in the port loaded with goods from the Indies. Also particularly important, were the towns of **Sanlúcar de Barrameda** with the **Medina Sidonia Palace**, which has a valuable archive of American interest; the **Puerto de Santa María** with its houses-palaces and **Jerez de la Frontera**, with its magnificent Baroque Monastery.



Inca Garcilaso de la Vega (1539-1616)

Born in Cuzco (Peru), Gómez Suárez de Figueroa, nicknamed Inca Garcilaso de la Vega, was the son of the Spanish captain Garcilaso de la Vega and of the Incan princess Chimpu Ocllo. He arrived in Spain in 1560, first establishing himself in Montilla and later in Cordoba, where he would remain until his death. He is considered to be the first and main historian of America, with works such as his « Comentarios Reales de los Incas » (Royal Commentaries of the Incas).

The American influence is also very present in the **province of Cordoba**, with the town of **Montilla** having a special relationship with the American continent and its people. From here thousands of locals from Montilla set off to the Indies, including **Friar Francisco Solano** or **Diego de Alvear y Ponce de León** (an important soldier and Spanish politician), but it was also a region that adopted many others, including **Inca Garcilaso de la Vega**, a writer and historian with Hispano-Incan roots. Also from Cordoba, was

Beatriz Enríquez de Arana, the mother of **Hernando Colón**, who would become an important humanist.

In terms of architecture, the mutual inspiration between continents is also reflected in the importance of the **Jaen Cathedral** as a model of American Renaissance cathedrals, or, alternatively, the influence of American towns with checkerboard urban designs in the New Settlements of Andalusia and Sierra Morena (Jaen, Cordoba, Seville).

In the province of **Malaga**, we have to mention the towns of **Ronda**, given its Indiano legacy, which still preserves the **Casa de Moctezuma**, residence of the direct descendants of the last Mexican emperor, and the **Salvatierra Palace**, with its Indiano style; and the **Macharaviaya** villa, which, during the 18th century, prospered under the **Gálvez** family (viceroys and governors), when a Royal Playing Card Factory was established, with the cards being exported to America under a monopoly.

A blend of cultures

Andalusian cuisine was enriched with products unknown until then in medieval Europe, which **Columbus** would bring on his voyages and which were gradually incorporated into traditional dishes. *Salmorejo* would be made with the **tomatoes** and **potatoes**, originally disregarded by the wealthy, would be used to make tortilla; while **peppers** would be used to obtain *pimentón*, an essential condiment in many of our regional dishes including cold cuts such as chorizo. Other

significant new products were **corn**, beans, **cocoa**, **vanilla** and **exotic fruits** such as pineapple, custard apple, avocado, papaya and mango. But this blend of cultures was also reflected on the American continent, since today, one cannot think of Caribbean countries without rum, a beverage made by all of them, which is made with **cane sugar**, introduced from the Costa Tropical in Andalusia. Likewise, mention must be given to the commercial exploitation of Indiano colorants such as indigo or cochineal, new dyes that would

revolutionise the European textile industry.

The cultural relationship between Andalusia and the American continent was and continues to be strong, as evidenced by important events and contests held in the region of Andalusia such as the **Ibero-American Film Festival in Huelva** and the **Ibero-American Theatre Festival in Cadiz**, which received the Gold Medal of Merit in Fine Arts in 2003 and together with other scenic art festivals such as La Habana (Cuba), the Manzanales Festival (Mexico) or the FITAZ de la Paz (Bolivia). We cannot forget other events directly related to the Discovery of America such as the **Colombino**

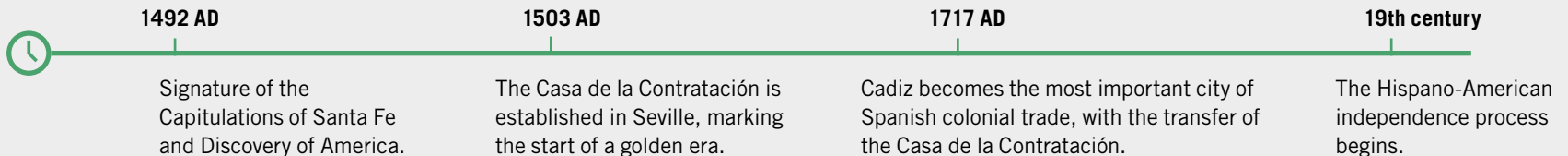

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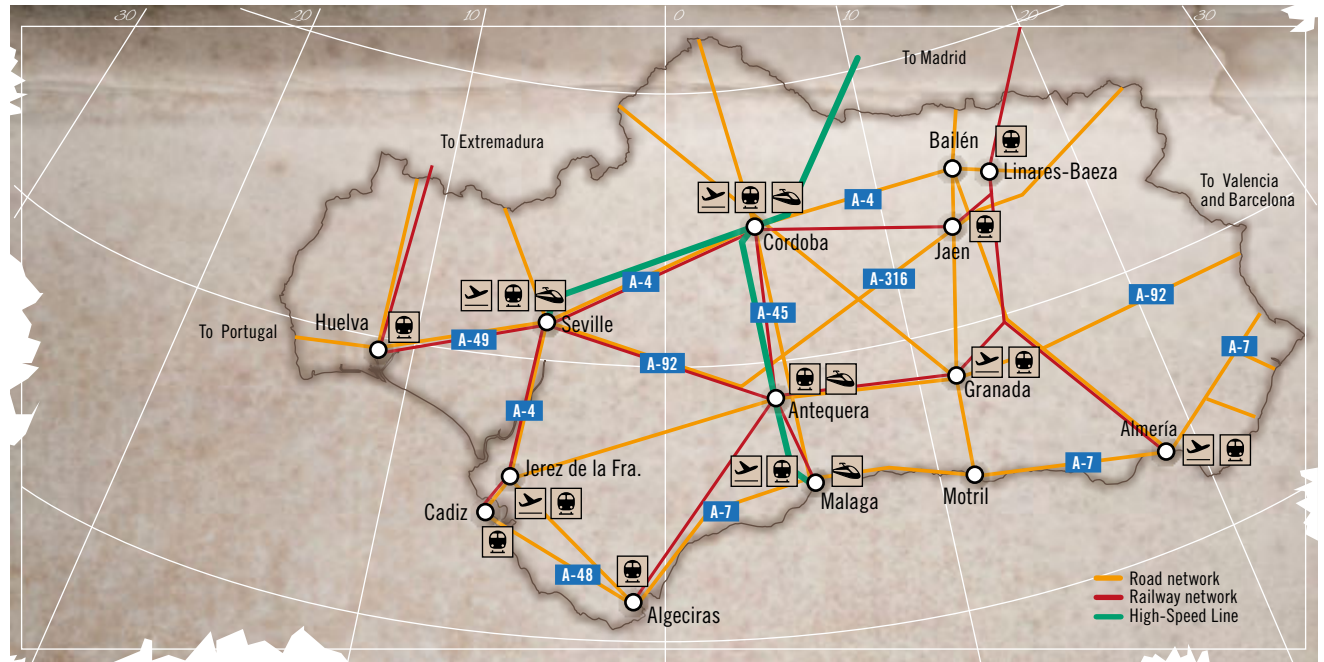

Ibero-American experiences

'Andalusia, your Roots', offers the possibility of enjoying a whole host of activities, from those focused on discovering the cultural and monumental heritage of our ancestors to visiting places in which the Encounter with America was planned and the monuments that influenced the architecture of Columbus' America to others focused on leisure activities, such as visits to vineyards and wineries with wine-tasting activities, gastronomy and bullfighting routes or arts and crafts workshops. While staying in unique establishments in a wonderfully natural setting, ideal for astronomy tourism, horse riding or enjoying live bandit shows.

Connections network

The region has a magnificent transport network, with modern roads communicating the main cities in the region. Trains are without doubt one of the most convenient ways of getting around Andalusia, particularly thanks to the High-Speed Train (AVE), which has stations in Seville, Malaga and Cordoba. There are also six airports in the autonomous community, five of which are international airports: Malaga-Costa del Sol, Seville, Jerez de la Frontera (Cadiz), Almeria and Granada-Jaen.

Cristo del Llano side-chapel: round trip to the baroque

Are you familiar with the most beautiful and unknown spectacular baroque side-chapel of Andalusia? It lies hidden within a monumental shrine in a far-away village of the Sierra Morena: Baños de la Encina.



No doubt, the Andalusian baroque set the tone for the artistic preferences of Hispanic America, and proof of this are the overly ornate side-chapels dedicated to Maria and dispersed throughout the entire continent. However, as occurs with music, the influence was a mutual round trip. And this generous meetings was born in this tiny shrine in the mountains: colourful exotic plants, parrots, and figureheads are proof of this.

the town's historic centre, at the feet of the castle and on its oldest street. Just a stone's throw away are the Andujar Mountains and Despeñaperros Nature Parks. Los Gálvez route and its wine, Roots of the New World

25 minutes from Malaga, Macharaviaya, a white village on the Costa del Sol, halfway between the mountains and the sea, with Arabic roots and designs, holds the secret of a poor family of shepherds who climbed to the highest levels of society to become the illustrious King Charles III.

José de Gálvez (Prime Minister), Miguel (ambassador in Russia), Matías (Viceroy of New Spain and named “the first father of the Homeland” by the city council of Guatemala) and their son, Bernardo de Gálvez (war hero, also viceroy of New Spain after the death of his father and today Honorary Citizen of the USA), built the foundations of modern society on both sides of the Atlantic.

Such important events, like the independence of the USA or the



administrative organisation of Central America, from California or La Luisiana to Mexico and Guatemala; the creation of the Archive of the Indies and the opening of the port of Malaga to commerce with the New World, are some of the achievements we owe to this family, a line that disappeared like foam in the tempest of time, which we are now remembering as a bridge between the Spanish and American cultures.

Argentina and Spain through Diego de Alvear y Ponce de León

Diego Alvear y Ponce de León was a brigadier in the Spanish navy, a native of Montilla who emigrated to Argentina.



After marking out the territories between Spain and Portugal he returned to Montilla, but a fatal accident with the sinking of the frigate Ntra. Sra. de las Mercedes all his family perished on the coast of Cadiz, except his son Carlos María Alvear, whose grandson became President of the Republic of Argentina.

We recover the story of this character as we visit wine-cellars and stroll through the streets of Montilla in search of his legacy. There is a statue of him in Cadiz as he was a member of the Cadiz Parliament and defended the Island of León against Napoleon.

Visit the San Juan Bautista Church. Zurbarán Parish Collection

A temple declared of Cultural Interest and Gothic-Mudejar style (15th century), the San Juan Bautista Church has the most interesting Works.

As the main altarpiece by Alejo and Jorge Fernández, considered one of the greatest interest of Gothic Seville. It also has a magnificent Baroque choir (1715-17), gilded monstrance by Francisco de Alfaro (1575), which is carried in the Corpus Christi procession, as well as a collection of nine works by Zurbarán, located in the church's sacristy (1634-37).

The Church of San Juan Bautista was founded after the Christian conquest



of Marchena and may be linked to the presence of the order of San Juan in the town, documented since the 13th century. All that remains from this original period is the chapel that stands under the tower.

It was founded by Rodrigo Ponce de León and the Pacheco family, as revealed in his will and the heraldry that presides over the triumphal arch in the presbytery.

Visit to the San Agustín Church

It is renowned for its sheer size, courtly façade and spectacular decor indoors with polychrome plasterwork which had some type of Hispanic-American influence in their design.

The Baroque Church of San Agustín was built between the 17th-18th centuries. Designed as the temple-pantheon of the Ponce de León family, it is the final resting place of Manuel Ponce de León, 6th Duke of Arcos. The project corresponds to the master building of Toledo Cathedral, Bartolomé Zumbigo, who designed the church following the model of El Escorial and the style of Madrid churches. It was completed by the master builder Alonso Moreno.



It features a courtly façade with simple, austere decoration. This contrasts with the unusual interior decoration, unique in Spanish Baroque, comprising very interesting polychrome plasterwork, as a result of its themes with Aztec and Inca influences. Tropical flora and fauna (pumas and snakes) and elements of a magical-religious character like the Sun and the Moon, typical of Inca mythology in Peru.

Belonging to the Montiel Paz Ponce de León family, one of its members, Juan Ponce de León, who was the discoverer of Florida.

The Casa del Ave María is a palatial mansion whose first work dates from the late 15th-century. It has undergone several renovations throughout history, highlighting the one from 1620, which built two rooms covered by framework of Moorish tradition and which recalls the work of Diego López de Arenas,

master carpenter and a treatise writer of white woodwork. It was home of the Ramírez de Cartagena family (perpetual governor of the Chancery of Granada). The Mendigutia family inherited it, and it also belonged to the Lorenzo Coullaut Valera family, author of the monument to Bécquer in Seville.

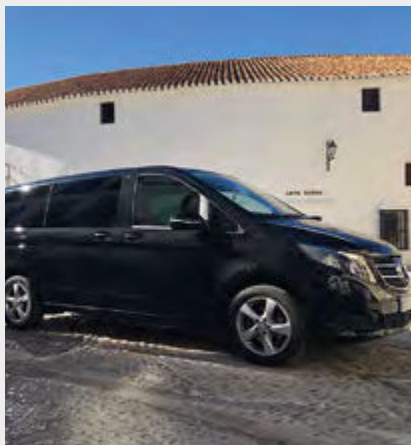
